The fair provides affordable artwork and a laid back atmosphere on grassy, treed lawns nestled among the Kemper Museum of

Contemporary Art, the Kansas City Art Institute and the Nelson-Atkins Museum of Art.

With growing popularity and so many applicants, the UNplaza Art Fair remains a juried show, but there is no entry fee. Artists agree to donate a percentage of their earnings to PeaceWorks, KC as their fee.

PeaceWorks, KC is a not-for-profit, all volunteer organization formed in 1982. Proceeds from the fair are used in their work for peace.

Some programs that benefit are “Adopt-A-Minefield”, Unitown (a KC Harmony program benefiting area teens), Park University and Avila University peace studies scholarships, The PeaceWorks Newsletter, The Community Organization Directory of Peace, Justice, Human Rights and the Environment, The Kansas City Plant Awareness Project (The KC Plant are builders of 85% of nuclear weapons components) and the sponsorship of many local peace and justice related speakers and events, such as Iraq War Peace Rallies and the Hiroshima Remembrance Ceremony held at loose park in August. Our National affiliate is Peace Action, the nation’s largest peace and justice group celebrating 50 years of activism in 2007.
